
4. Audit update:

FROM THE PRACTICE TEE TO THE GOLF COURSE - PART 1

An incredibly important part of becoming a complete player involves the mental side of the game, which for most that play this game is overlooked or disregarded. There are many facets and skills needed on the mental side of golf that need to be addressed, acknowledged and practiced in order for any player to get to his/her's next level. Examples of achieving a next level performance may be just being able to beat your golfing buddy regularly, lowering your handicap by 50%, qualifying for the club championship, winning your club championship flight, qualifying for a state tournament, etc, etc. If you disregard the mental and emotional side of the game, you will simply not achieve your golfing potential, it's that simple and important.

As a golf instructor, I hear it all the time, "I hit it great on the practice tee but I can't score or bring it to the golf course." Practice areas are littered with players that hit the ball sufficiently well at the range but play poorly on the golf course when it counts. If you're hitting it great on the practice tee, then it's NOT a physical thing. If you're not hitting it good on the practice tee, then physical changes need to be made to fix it.

So, why does this happen? There are a number of things that change when this player then goes to the first tee. When we are working on our swing at the range we are working on a PROCESS. A process can be things like set-up, takeaway, weight transfer, rotation, release, balance, etc. When you're hitting the ball well, this process is working because the ball is going where you want it to. If you step on the 1st tee and spring it off the planet after hitting it good on the range, then your perception and emotional state has changed. Typically, what happens to most is that the result of the shot at hand ("don't miss the fairway," "don't hit it out of bounds right," "don't hit it in the water," "please get it on the green" are examples) becomes the main focus. None of these thoughts entered your mind while you were hitting beautiful shots on the range. The PROCESS that worked so well on the practice tee was abandoned and the negatively charged RESULT of where you don't want the ball to go dominates your mind.

Players who have learned or figured this out for themselves do reach their potential. Practice and play are no different to these players. In fact, playing is typically better than practice. They become immersed and committed in their PROCESS on the course, which allows them to compete and play at THEIR best.

I will address other mental and emotional issues that change from the practice tee to the first tee in next month's issue. See you on the lesson tee!

Dear Salem Members,

July made up for some of our less than favorable Summer weather with record breaking temperatures and the warmest July in the Boston area since the weather service began keeping records! Along with the weather and outstanding course conditions, Salem Country Club also had lots of good member news: Steven DiLisio won the Mass Amateur, Kevin Daly won the SCC Men's Club Championship for the 4th consecutive year and the SCC Met League Team finished in first place for the second season in a row!

Steven will compete in the US Amateur at Pinehurst (Nos. 2 and 4), North Carolina, August 11-18. The event begins with two rounds of stroke-play with the top 64 scores moving on to match play. From there, five rounds of 18-hole match-play will narrow the field down to the 36-hole championship final 6th match.

The Met League Team will enter the year-end playoffs as the number 1 seed and will host its first match at SCC on August 15. Six (6) teams make this year's playoffs with the Top 2 teams getting byes...it appears Salem and Tedesco have locked up the byes.

The course looked in great shape...temps were in the mid-80's with almost no wind and although the greens were smooth...they were a little slow. Medalist **Kevin Daly's** 71 led the lineup with **Nick Mini 73, Charlie Fox 76, Dave Schelzi 76, Chuck Mace 77, Matt Nekoroski 77, Wayne Guyer 78 and Kevin MacIntyre 79.**

WOW...what a showing by the Home Team...making up for last year's 48-42 loss at Weston, and kudos to Kip and staff for having the course in spectacular condition! The pins were the US Sr. Open "Friday" pins and were definitely more accessible than our usual "Saturday" pins... weather was perfect with a 7-mph east wind...the lineup featured four (4) 2019 rookies: **Ryan Connelly, Bob Wight, Gary Neals and Vin Sutera.** We had Co-Medalists...**Ken Haskell, Jr. and Chuck Mace both shot 76, Co-Captain Kevin MacIntyre 77...Nick Mini, Bob Wight and Ryan Connelly all shot 78.**

7/25 SALEM 46.5 OAKLEY 43.5 WITCHES BEAT OAKLEY ... CLINCH BACK TO BACK CARANGELO CUPS!!

This was a hard-fought final regular season match with Salem winning by only 3 points. The pins were in the Saturday Senior Open positions – difficult for all. **Mike McLaughlin and Nick Mini** lost by 2 holes, shooting a combined better-ball score of 72; Co-Captain **Kevin MacIntyre and Greg Badger** won 6-up shooting a combined better-ball 70; **Josh Leeman and Dave Sacco** lost by 1, shooting a better-ball 72; **Bob Bogart and Mike Williams** won by 2 shooting a better-ball 72; **Jon Nekoroski and Mike McDougall, Jr.** lost by 2, shooting a better-ball 79.

Twi League:

The SCC Twi team split its only two matches played to date (up to the last week in July), winning 49-41 at home against Wellesley on 7/17 and losing 41-49 away at Brae Burn on 7/26. The three remaining matches are all on the road, at Winchester and Nashawtuc both on 7/31, (and both rescheduled matches) and a scheduled match at Walpole on 8/2 making the final week quite challenging.

August 2019

Highlights of the weather shortened Wellesley match were the **Leigh Nali/Mark Tarpey and Guy Ciolfi/Jamie Giordano** team's 2-up wins, and the **Ed Kaestner/John DePamphilis** duo scoring a convincing 4-up win. In the two halved matches both the **Bill Miller/Jim Hoefner and Will Wiswall/Rob Curley** twosomes battled back from deficits. Later in the month, the Salem lineup fell at Brae Burn on a soggy track after a morning and prior evening of heavy rain.

As of this writing, our Salem Twi team has played 9 matches and has an even split, 4 wins, 4 losses and one tie. The SCC team is averaging 45.0 points/match, which puts our team in 10th place. Participating in the playoffs will require solid wins over the three remaining away opponents who all sit just above us in the standings. A tough task ... but doable!

The Friday Night Scotch has changed!

If you weren't aware, the Friday Night Scotch has changed! We now play an alternate shot format with 3 teams (6 players) in each group. With the alternate shot format, there are only 3 balls in play (previously 4 balls in play with only 4 members in each group) so we can accommodate more players (up to 96) and still have everyone get their round in before darkness sets in. We had over 80 players signed up on the initial go with this format and it **took much less time than before. Most of the feedback has been very positive.**

And now the bad news ...

Not all the news in July was good. Particularly troublesome is rude and disrespectful behavior by some members towards other members. Here are a few examples:

• Couple A gets a tee time on Sunday afternoon, leaving two of the tee times available (they could have used X's but preferred to make the other times available to all). They asked couple B to join them but before they get a response, couple J signs up for the other two openings. Couple A tells couple B that there is no longer any room for them and looks forward to playing with couple J with whom they have never played. This is all well and good but what has happened to a number of members is that they waited on the first tee for couple J but couple J never showed up! No call, no discussion. This should **never** happen. Please call the other couple when you plan to join them and once you have signed up consider it a commitment. And be sure to call when plans change ... don't hide behind ForeTees!

• One complaint heard many times from members is slow play on Sunday afternoons. One egregious example was a group of new members and guests having a grand old time on the course taking pictures and videos on the course further slowing down play such that there were two groups waiting to tee off on 12 and the group behind these slow players arriving at 18 to find the aforementioned group still on the tee taking pictures with an open hole in front of them! It used to be that social members waiting for golf (now called non-voting waiting or NVW) could only play with a member and we didn't see this type of behavior. No one wants to go back to this. Please play ready golf and refrain from slow play.

• A new male member jumped in front of a group of Salem women golfers with no discussion and without permission from the group and then promptly shanked his shot, almost hitting one of the ladies in the head. He didn't apologize or say anything until one of the ladies gave him a piece of her mind and then he apologized. This behavior is beyond comprehension. New members who are on the list waiting for golf need to keep in mind that any letters written against them for this type of behavior can keep them from being accepted into the club. And no one wants to go back to the time when members on the list had to play with full members, which prevented this type of behavior but made a horrible situation for those on the list.

• During a Met League match a Salem member parked his cart on 11 because he didn't want to walk to the hitting area from the paved parking at the short end of the range. The cart was in the field of play ... it could have caused problems during the matches. Carts are not allowed to be parked on 11 when the teeing area is forward of the mats on the short end.

Lastly, if you haven't done so please read the rules and regulations published in your Blue Books. We at Salem Country Club pride ourselves in following the rules and being kind and respectful to others.

Although I enjoy the game of golf, I am a mediocre player and have difficulty reading greens. My visual acuity is 20/40 - a little nearsighted. My favorite caddie, Jim, usually stands behind me on the extended line of play and gives me advice after I take my stance. He then moves to the side.

Yesterday, my opponent, Diane, said I was breaking the new Advice Rule because Jim stood behind me after I took my stance. She claimed that, under the general penalty rule in Match Play, I lost the hole! She thinks she knows all the rules, because she went to a Rules Seminar in the spring. Although we agreed to disagree, please tell me that Diane interpreted the rule change incorrectly

and that she took too many Smarty Pants 🚟 vitamins yesterday morning.

Dear Ms. Myopia,

Diane interpreted the rule change correctly and you are a year behind in the Advice Rule. Last year, Jim could stand in the Line of Play while you took your stance and then move to the side. Under the new rule 10.2b (4) - Restriction on Caddie Standing Behind Player, the caddie cannot stand on or close to the Line of Play when the player begins taking his/her stance. Before you started to take your stance, you should have told Jim to move. Had he been current with the new rules, he would have moved before you took your stance.



I suggest you get two copies of the 2019 Rules of Golf, one for you and one for Jim. Also, I recommend that you attend one of the next Rules of Golf Seminars with Diane, but it would probably be best, Ms. Myopia, if you didn't drive...
