


Here's the update:

Our projected deficit was cut by approximately 53% from last month. Forecasted year end amounts assume no new members added to the wait list. Stocks were sold after month end to get the fixed income amount up to the \$2M floor.

- 3. Rounds played through 04/30/19 and 04/30/18 were 1,225 and 767, respectively. This means we had a 60% increase in play from last year. 86% of the rounds were played by voting members, their family and their guests. 59% of the rounds were by cart. Comparative figures for 2018 are: 85% of the rounds were played by voting members, their family and 57% of the rounds were by cart.
- 4. The Investment Committee is reviewing our Investment Policy Statement and risk tolerance levels. Amongst the items being discussed at the Membership, Planning, Dues and Finance Committees: initiation fee amount, membership count levels, flattening and simplifying the dues structure and fully funding depreciation in dues,

### HOW TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT WEDGES - LOFT and BOUNCE

In fitting wedges to a player I first need to know their current full set make-up to know how many wedges are needed or warranted. Everyone should have a minimum of 3 wedges in their set and preferably 4. If a player is deciding whether to add another fairway wood, hybrid or wedge to their set to get them to 14 total clubs, I would most definitely recommend adding another wedge. Sets with 3 wedges will need a 6 degree LOFT gap between clubs. Sets with 4 wedges typically will have 4 degree LOFT gaps between clubs. A 4 wedge set would then include a pitching wedge (45-49 degrees), a gap wedge (50-53 degrees), a sand wedge (54-58 degrees) and a lob wedge (59-64 degrees).

The 2nd thing to consider in choosing wedges is the bounce angle options available. Nearly all modern manufactured wedges have BOUNCE angle identifications on each club. The BOUNCE angle is the slope or angle of the sole of the wedge from the leading edge to the trail edge. BOUNCE angles range anywhere from 4 degrees to 14 degrees. Low BOUNCE angle wedges work better on firm turf and sand and high BOUNCE angle wedges work best on soft turf and sand. At Salem CC, with typically soft turf and sand, I recommend high BOUNCE wedges for most people. As Titleist's Bob Vokey says, "BOUNCE is your friend".

The last consideration toward choosing the best wedges for your game is the GRIND. The GRIND refers to the shape of the club head, specifically the sole. Depending on turf conditions and a player's delivery tendencies, certain grinds may work better than others. The #1 wedge played on ALL the worldwide tours week in and week out is the Vokey designed Titleist wedges. Kevin should have a demo bag of wedges in the Golf Shop with various lofts, bounce angles and grinds to experiment with.

The most important element in improved wedge play is proper technique. You can have the greatest tools/clubs in your bag but if they are not being used properly you will not get the results you want. Register for a Short Game School or private Short Game lesson to know how to use your wedges so that they function the way they've been designed. See you on the lesson tee!

Dear George:

Both my ball and my opponent's ball landed in a large sand bunker on a par 3 hole. Mine was Embedded in the lip of the sand and unplayable; my opponent's ball was buried in the sand and could Not be easily identified.

I was told by a senior club member, with a 30 handicap, that under the new rules, I could take the ball outside the bunker with just a one-stroke penalty. I took his advice and played it from outside. My next shot landed on the green for a tap in bogey! My opponent, Meathead, disagreed with the 30 handicapper's advice.

Then Meathead removed a lot of sand from around his ball to identify it and hit it out of the bunker onto the green and sank his putt for a par. What are the bunker relief rules?

Dear Archie:

The good news is that you won the hole although you and Meathead both violated the rules in the process. Why? You made two mistakes. First, you took advice from a 30 handicapper who probably couldn't get out of a bunker with a shovel; second, you incurred a two-stroke penalty when taking the ball outside of the bunker. At that point, you should have recorded a double bogey. See Rule 19.3 Relief Options for Unplayable Ball in Bunker.

Your opponent lost the hole, because he did not recreate the original lie in the sand by failing to put the sand back around the ball. He violated Rule 8.1a (4), Course Played as It Is Found.

Diagram 19.3: RELIEF OPTIONS FOR BALL UNPLAYABLE IN BUNKER



A player decides that his or her ball in a bunker is unplayable. The player has 4 options:

- 1) For a one penalty stroke, the player may take stroke-and-distance relief.
- 2) For a one penalty stroke, the player may take back-on-the-line relief in the bunker.
- 3) For a one penalty stroke, the player may take lateral relief in the bunker.
- 4) For a total of two penalty strokes, the player may take back-on-the-line relief outside the bunker based on a reference line going straight back from the hole through the spot of the original ball.



## **From the Green Committee**

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the membership for your patience during the projects that have been undertaken this spring. Here are the updates:

- 1) XGD The XGD crews have completed holes 2 (including approach), 6 (including approach), 7, 8, 9, 14 (including approach), 17 and 18. They also completed 1 fairway and the practice putting green. They will return in mid to late October to finish the rest of the greens.
- 2) Aeration of the fairways Plugs were pulled and the fairways were top dressed with sand and over-seeded with Bent Grass. This was completed in mid-May and the course should be in prime shape for the Four-Ball.
- 3) Green Aeration The greens were punched with 3/8 inch solid tines and were top-dressed with sand. This was minimally invasive and did not have much disruption to the playing surface.

The Green Committee would like to ask for your cooperation and best efforts in the following areas:

- 1) Divots Please make every effort to replace your divots in the rough and fairways. The best solution is to replace the whole divot. If the divot breaks apart, do your best to replace what is possible and then finish filling the void with the divot mix that is provided on your golf cart. While you are waiting for your playing partners to hit, look around and fill any divots that catch your eye.
- 2) Ball Marks Now that the greens are firming up, it is sometimes difficult to find your ball mark. The rule is Fix Your Ball Mark And 2 Others. This way, if you don't find your ball mark, you will be fixing 2-3 others and the greens will be smoother.
- Signs Please be sure to pay attention to all signs such as EXIT, WET AREA, NO CARTS, CART PATH ONLY etc. The routing of golf cart traffic can spare the course from unnecessary damage.

If we all work together and take pride in our Golf Course, the results will speak for themselves. Thank you all for your help!!!




